


What did Martha say in John 11:39?



# Nisan 10

Joh 12:2 Here a dinner was given in Jesus' honor. Martha served, while Lazarus was among those reclining at the table with him.

Joh 12:3 Then Mary took about a pint of pure nard, an expensive perfume; she poured it on Jesus' feet and wiped his feet with her hair. And the house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume. Joh 12:4 But one of his disciples, Judas Iscariot, who was later to betray him, objected, Joh 12:5 "Why wasn't this perfume sold and the money given to the poor? It was worth a year's wages." Joh 12:6 He did not say this because he cared about the poor but because he was a thief; as keeper of the money bag, he used to help himself to what was put into it. Mar 11:12 The next day as they were leaving Bethany, Jesus was hungry. Mar 11:13 Seeing in the distance a fig tree in leaf, he went to find out if it had any fruit. When he reached it, he found nothing but leaves, because it was not the season for figs.

Mar 11:14 Then he said to the tree, "May no one ever eat fruit from you again." And his disciples heard him say it. Mar 11:15 On reaching Jerusalem, Jesus entered the temple area and began driving out those who were buying and selling there. He overturned the tables of the money changers and the benches of those selling doves,

Mar 11:16 and would not allow anyone to carry merchandise through the temple courts. Mar 11:17 And as he taught them, he said, "Is it not written: "'My house will be called a house of prayer for all nations'? But you have made it 'a den of robbers." Mar 11:18 The chief priests and the teachers of the law heard this and began looking for a way to kill him, for they feared him, because the whole crowd was amazed at his teaching. Mar 11:19 When evening came, they went out of the city. Mat 21:17 And he left them and went out of the city to Bethany, where he spent the night. Mat 21:18 Early in the morning, as he was on his way back to the city, he was hungry.

Mat 21:19 Seeing a fig tree by the road, he went up to it but found nothing on it except leaves. Then he said to it, "May you never bear fruit again!" Immediately the tree withered. Mat 21:20 When the disciples saw this, they were amazed. "How did the fig tree wither so quickly?" they asked.

#### Nisan 14

Mat 26:17 On the first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, the disciples came to Jesus and asked, "Where do you want us to make preparations for you to eat the Passover?" Mat 26:18 He replied, "Go into the city to a certain man and tell him, 'The Teacher says: My appointed time is near. I am going to celebrate the Passover with my disciples at your house."

Mat 26:19 So the disciples did as Jesus had directed them and prepared the Passover. Mat 26:20 When evening came, Jesus was reclining at the table with the Twelve. Mat 26:21 And while they were eating, he said, "I tell you the truth, one of you will betray me."

Mat 26:22 They were very sad and began to say to him one after the other, "Surely not I, Lord?" Mat 26:23 Jesus replied, "The one who has dipped his hand into the bowl with me will betray me. Mat 26:24 The Son of Man will go just as it is written about him. But woe to that man who betrays the Son of Man! It would be better for him if he had not been born."

Mat 26:25 Then Judas, the one who would betray him, said, "Surely not I, Rabbi?" Jesus answered, "Yes, it is you." Mat 26:26 While they were eating, Jesus took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take and eat; this is my body." Mat 26:27 Then he took the cup, gave thanks and offered it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you.

Luk 23:50 Now there was a man named Joseph, a member of the Council, a good and upright man, Luk 23:51 who had not consented to their decision and action. He came from the Judean town of Arimathea and he was waiting for the kingdom of God. Luk 23:52 Going to Pilate, he asked for Jesus' body.

Luk 23:53 Then he took it down, wrapped it in linen cloth and placed it in a tomb cut in the rock, one in which no one had yet been laid. Luk 23:54 It was Preparation Day, and the Sabbath was about to begin. Luk 23:55 The women who had come with Jesus from Galilee followed Joseph and saw the tomb and how his body was laid in it.

Joh 19:31 Now it was the day of Preparation, and the next day was to be a special Sabbath. Because the Jews did not want the bodies left on the crosses during the Sabbath, they asked Pilate to have the legs broken and the bodies taken down. Joh 19:32 The soldiers therefore came and broke the legs of the first man who had been crucified with Jesus, and then those of the other.

Joh 19:33 But when they came to Jesus and found that he was already dead, they did not break his legs. Joh 19:34 Instead, one of the soldiers pierced Jesus' side with a spear, bringing a sudden flow of blood and water. Joh 19:35 The man who saw it has given testimony, and his testimony is true. He knows that he tells the truth, and he testifies so that you also may believe.

Joh 19:36 These things happened so that the scripture would be fulfilled: "Not one of his bones will be broken," Joh 19:37 and, as another scripture says, "They will look on the one they have pierced." Joh 19:38 Later, Joseph of Arimathea asked Pilate for the body of Jesus. Now Joseph was a disciple of Jesus, but secretly because he feared the Jews. With Pilate's permission, he came and took the body away. Joh 19:39 He was accompanied by Nicodemus, the man who earlier had visited Jesus at night. Nicodemus brought a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about seventy-five pounds.

Joh 19:40 Taking Jesus' body, the two of them wrapped it, with the spices, in strips of linen. This was in accordance with Jewish burial customs. Joh 19:41 At the place where Jesus was crucified, there was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb, in which no one had ever been laid. Joh 19:42 Because it was the Jewish day of Preparation and since the tomb was nearby, they laid Jesus there.

Mar 15:42 It was Preparation Day (that is, the day before the Sabbath). So as evening approached,

Mar 15:43 Joseph of Arimathea, a prominent member of the Council, who was himself waiting for the kingdom of God, went boldly to Pilate and asked for Jesus' body. Mar 15:44 Pilate was surprised to hear that he was already dead. Summoning the centurion, he asked him if Jesus had already died. Mar 15:45 When he learned from the centurion that it was so, he gave the body to Joseph. Mar 15:46 So Joseph bought some linen cloth, took down the body, wrapped it in the linen, and placed it in a tomb cut out of rock. Then he rolled a stone against the entrance of the tomb.
