- I plan to fulfill the scriptural instructions to help the strangers, widows, fatherless and poor to enjoy the Feast.
- I plan to take care of my health – get enough sleep, eat properly and get some exercise.
- I plan to make time for my children to do their homework (if required) and check on their progress.

Welcome to the Feast of Tabernacles!

We don't know your specific circumstances and the effort you exerted to get here. What we do know is that God wants you here to engage in experiential learning. This is to be a joyous feast! Please set a definite intention to make the most of this year's feast by ensuring it's a joyful feast.

“And you shall rejoice in your feast, you and your son and your daughter, your male servant and your female servant and the Levite, the stranger and the fatherless and the widow, who are within your gates. Seven days you shall keep a sacred feast to the Lord your God in the place which the Lord chooses, because the Lord your God will bless you in all your produce and in all the work of your hands, so that you surely rejoice.”

(Deuteronomy 16.14–15 NKJV)

Also, remember we are here to learn to fear God.

“You shall truly tithe all the increase of your grain that the field produces year by year. And you shall eat before the Lord your God, in the place where He chooses to make His name abide, the tithe of your grain and your new wine and your oil, of the firstborn of your herds and your flocks, that you may learn to fear the Lord your God always.”

(Deuteronomy 14.22–23 NKJV)

When God established His covenant with ancient Israel, it was His intention to set them up as a peculiar nation of king-priests that would lead the rest of mankind to Him.

“Now therefore, if you will indeed obey My voice and keep My covenant, then you shall be a special treasure to Me above all people; for all the earth is Mine. And you shall be to Me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation.’ These are the words which you shall speak to the children of Israel.”

(Exodus 19.5–6 NKJV)

Unfortunately, they broke that covenant with God. God, however, did not break His covenant with them. He set in motion a plan to redeem Israel through a new covenant. With this new covenant, God's holy spirit would be placed inside them, and lead them to love God and to love His law. As God's church, Israel, once again, is a peculiar people. (1 Peter 2.9 KJV)
