

# The Prophets of God

God has many roles for men & women in His worship & service:

## 1. Priests – offering sacrifices, leading worship, teaching holiness

- **Malachi 2:7** – “For the lips of a priest should keep knowledge, and people should seek the law from his mouth; for he is the messenger of the Lord of hosts.”

## 2. Levites – assisting in temple worship, music, service, guarding

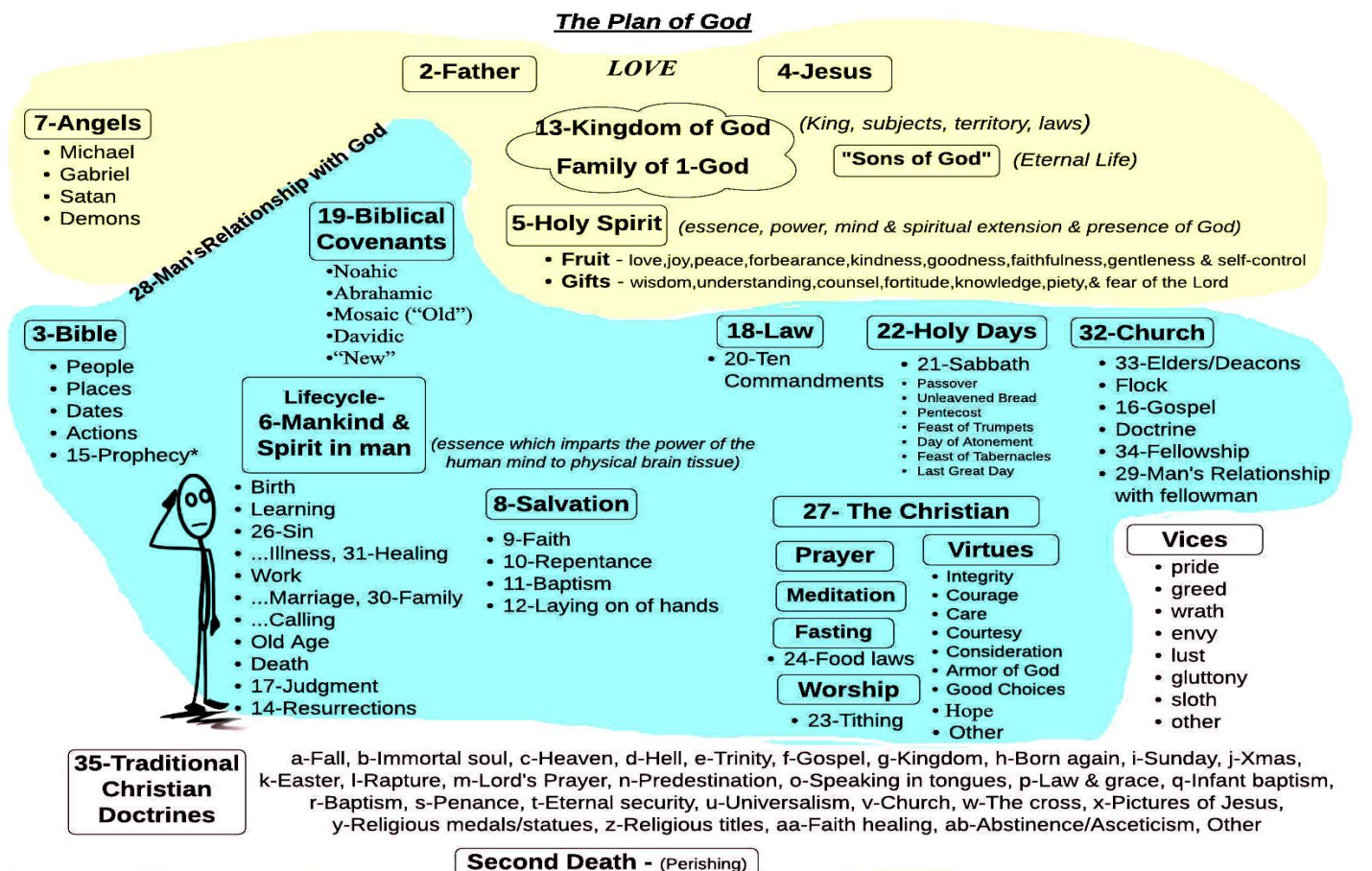
- **1 Chronicles 23:28, 30** – “Because their duty was to help the sons of Aaron... to stand every morning to thank and praise the LORD, and likewise at evening.”

## 3. Prophets – declaring God’s word, calling people back to true worship

- **2 Kings 17:13** – “Yet the LORD testified against Israel and against Judah, by all of His prophets, every seer, saying, ‘Turn from your evil ways, and keep My commandments...’”

## 4. Kings & Leaders – governing God’s people in righteousness, leading in covenant faithfulness

- **2 Samuel 23:3** – “He who rules over men must be just, ruling in the fear of God.”



**Time: (Past - History - Creation, 25-Hebrew Calendar ... Present - (World events) ... (Future - 15-Prophecy\*) ... Eternity ...)**

## 5. Judges & Deliverers – raised up to save God’s people and turn them to Him

- **Judges 2:16** – “Nevertheless, the LORD raised up judges who delivered them out of the hand of those who plundered them.”



## 6. Psalmists & Musicians – leading worship in song and praise

- **1 Chronicles 25:1** – “David and the captains of the army separated for the service some of the sons of Asaph, of Heman, and of Jeduthun, who should prophesy with harps, stringed instruments, and cymbals.”
- **Psalm 150:3-4** – “Praise Him with the sound of the trumpet; Praise Him with the lute and harp!”

## 7. Teachers & Scribes – explaining God’s Word, instructing in the law

- **Nehemiah 8:8** – “So they read distinctly from the book, in the Law of God; and they gave the sense, and helped them to understand the reading.”
- **Ezra 7:10** – “For Ezra had prepared his heart to seek the Law of the LORD, and to do it, and to teach statutes and ordinances in Israel.”

## 8. Disciples & Apostles – serving Christ by spreading the gospel, building the church

- **Matthew 28:19-20** – “Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations... teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you.”
- **Acts 6:4** – “But we will give ourselves continually to prayer and to the ministry of the word.”

## 9. Evangelists & Preachers – proclaiming the good news

- **2 Timothy 4:5** – “But you be watchful in all things, endure afflictions, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry.”
- **Romans 10:14** – “And how shall they hear without a preacher?”

## 10. Elders & Overseers – shepherding God’s people

- **1 Peter 5:2** – “Shepherd the flock of God which is among you, serving as overseers, not by compulsion but willingly, not for dishonest gain but eagerly.”
- **Acts 20:28** – “Therefore take heed to yourselves and to all the flock, among which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God...”

## 11. Servants & Deacons – serving practical needs of God’s people

- **Acts 6:3** – “Therefore, brethren, seek out from among you seven men of good reputation, full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom, whom we may appoint over this business.”
- **1 Timothy 3:10** – “But let these also first be tested; then let them serve as deacons, being found blameless.”

## 12. Prayer Warriors & Intercessors – standing in the gap for God’s people

- **Ezekiel 22:30** – “So I sought for a man among them who would make a wall, and stand in the gap before Me on behalf of the land...”
- **1 Timothy 2:8** – “I desire therefore that the men pray everywhere, lifting up holy hands, without wrath and doubting.”

### 13. Ordinary Believers – living sacrifices, daily worshippers of God

- **Romans 12:1** – “Present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service.”
- **Micah 6:8** – “He has shown you, O man, what is good; and what does the LORD require of you but to do justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God?”



### Definition of a Prophet of God

- A prophet is one called and sent by God to speak His word, reveal His will, and guide His people.
- They are God’s mouthpiece — not self-appointed, but chosen by the Lord.

#### Key Scriptures:

- **Deuteronomy 18:18** – “I will raise up for them a Prophet like you from among their brethren, and will put My words in His mouth, and He shall speak to them all that I command Him.”
- **Jeremiah 1:7** – “You shall go to all to whom I send you, and whatever I command you, you shall speak.”
- **2 Peter 1:21** – “For prophecy never came by the will of man, but holy men of God spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit.”

In short: **A prophet is one chosen by God to speak His words, reveal His will, and call people to obedience.**

*Are there thousands of prophets named in Scripture??-- nope! (I count around 66!)*

# Duties of a Prophet

## 1. Speak God's Word faithfully

- **Jeremiah 23:28** – “He who has My word, let him speak My word faithfully.”

## 2. Call people to repentance

- **Isaiah 58:1** – “Cry aloud, spare not; lift up your voice like a trumpet; tell My people their transgression, and the house of Jacob their sins.”

## 3. Warn of judgment & consequences of sin

- **Ezekiel 3:17–18** – Son of man, I have made you a watchman... give them warning from Me

## 4. Encourage obedience and covenant faithfulness

- **2 Chronicles 24:19** – “Yet He sent prophets to them, to bring them back to the LORD; and they testified against them, but they would not listen.”

## 5. Foretell future events (as revealed by God)

- **Isaiah 46:10** – “Declaring the end from the beginning, and from ancient times things that are not yet done.”
- **Daniel 2:28** – “But there is a God in heaven who reveals secrets, and He has made known... what will be in the latter days.”

## 6. Intercede in prayer for the people

- **Exodus 32:11** – “Then Moses pleaded with the LORD his God...”
- **Jeremiah 27:18** – “If they are prophets... let them now make intercession to the LORD of hosts.”

## 7. Confront kings, leaders, and nations with God's truth

- **2 Samuel 12:7** – “Then Nathan said to David, ‘You are the man!’”
- **1 Kings 18:18** – Elijah confronts Ahab: “You have forsaken the commandments of the LORD and have followed the Baals.”

## 8. Guide, instruct, and teach God's people

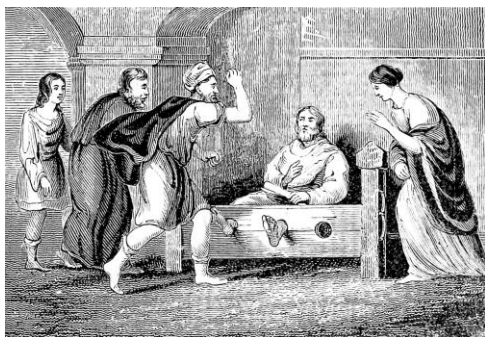
- **Hosea 12:10** – “I have also spoken by the prophets, and have multiplied visions; I have given symbols through the witness of the prophets.”

## 9. Perform signs and miracles as confirmation of God's message (when God wills)

- **1 Kings 18:36–38** – Elijah calls on the LORD, and fire falls from heaven.
- **2 Kings 5:14** – Elisha heals Naaman through God's power.

## 10. Suffer rejection and persecution for God's truth

- **Matthew 5:12** – “For so they persecuted the prophets who were before you.”
- **Jeremiah 20:2** – Jeremiah was beaten and put in stocks.



# Punishment for False Prophets

## 1. Death Penalty

- **Deuteronomy 18:20** – But the prophet who presumes to speak a word in My name, which I have not commanded him to speak, or who speaks in the name of other gods, that prophet shall die
- **Deuteronomy 13:5** – But that prophet or that dreamer of dreams shall be put to death, because he has spoken in order to turn you away from the LORD your God...

## 2. Exposed and Destroyed by God

- **Ezekiel 13:9** – My hand will be against the prophets who envision futility and who divine lies; they shall not be in the assembly of My people, nor be written in the record of the house of Israel, nor shall they enter into the land of Israel; then you shall know that I am the Lord GOD.

## 3. Shame, Destruction, and Judgment

- **Zechariah 13:3** – It shall come to pass that if anyone still prophesies, then his father and mother who begot him will say to him, ‘You shall not live, because you have spoken lies in the name of the LORD.’ And his father and mother who begot him shall thrust him through when he prophesies.
- **Matt 7:19** - Beware of false prophets... Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.

## More detail about a few of God’s faithful prophets

**Zechariah son of Jehoiada** was a priest and prophet in Judah, the son of the faithful high priest Jehoiada who had guided King Joash in righteousness during the early years of his reign. After Jehoiada’s death, however, Joash and the leaders of Judah turned away from the Lord, abandoning His temple and serving idols.

- **2 Chronicles 24:20–22** – “Then the Spirit of God came upon Zechariah the son of Jehoiada the priest, who stood above the people, and said to them, ‘Thus says God: “Why do you transgress the commandments of the Lord, so that you cannot prosper? Because you have forsaken the Lord, He also has forsaken you.” ’ So they conspired against him, and at the command of the king they stoned him with stones in the court of the house of the Lord. Thus Joash the king did not remember the kindness which Jehoiada his father had done to him, but killed his son; and as he died, he said, ‘The Lord look on it, and repay!’ ”

**John the Baptist** was the forerunner of Jesus Christ, called by God to prepare the way for the Messiah through preaching repentance and baptism (Matthew 3:1–3). He was bold, uncompromising, and fearless in speaking the truth—even before kings. His message confronted sin, calling both common people and rulers to repentance. Because of his faithfulness, John faced opposition and eventually imprisonment and death. His suffering stands as a testimony to the cost of faithfulness to God’s calling.

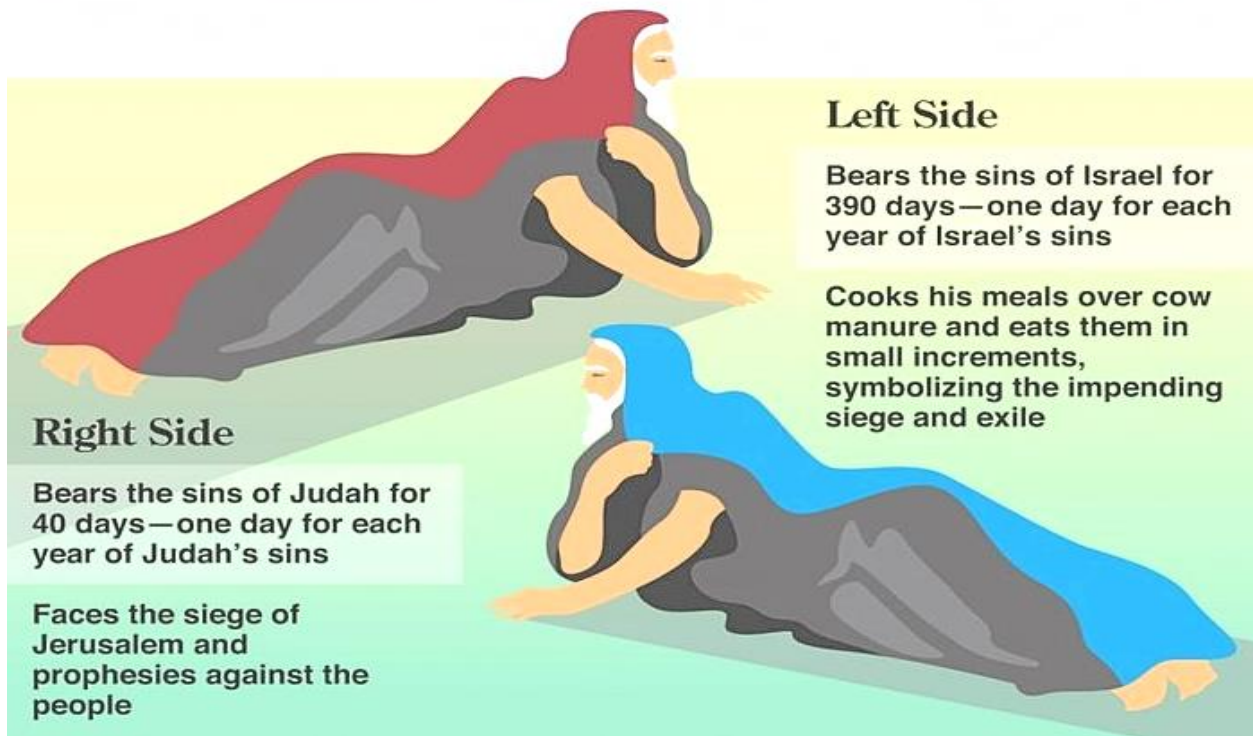


- **Mark 6:17–18** – “For Herod himself had sent and laid hold of John, and **bound him in prison** for the sake of Herodias, his brother Philip’s wife; for he had married her. Because John had said to Herod, ‘It is not lawful for you to have your brother’s wife.’”
- **Mark 6:24–28** – “So she went out and said to her mother, ‘What shall I ask?’ And she said, ‘The head of John the Baptist!’ Immediately she came in with haste to the king and asked, saying, ‘I want you to give me at once the head of John the Baptist on a platter.’ ... The king sent an executioner and commanded his head to be brought. And he went and beheaded him in prison, brought his head on a platter, and gave it to the girl; and the girl gave it to her mother.”

## Saying It Sideways

*Ezekiel 4:4–15*

Ezekiel spends more than a year lying on his side in order to illustrate God’s message to the people



Jer 36:1-3 Now it came to pass in the fourth year of Jehoiakim the son of Josiah, king of Judah, that this word came to **Jeremiah** from the LORD, saying: Take a scroll of a book and write on it all the words that I have spoken to you against Israel, against Judah, and against all the nations, from the day I spoke to you, from the days of Josiah even to this day. It may be that the house of Judah will hear all the adversities which I purpose to bring upon them, that everyone may turn from his evil way, that I may forgive their iniquity and their sin."





Jer 38:2 "Thus says the LORD: 'He who remains in this city shall die by the sword, by famine, and by pestilence; but he who goes over to the Chaldeans shall live; his life shall be as a prize to him, and he shall live.'

Jer 38:3 Thus says the LORD: 'This city shall surely be given into the hand of the king of Babylon's army, which shall take it.' "

Jer 38:4 Therefore the princes said to the king, "Please, let this man be put to death, for thus he weakens the hands of the men of war who

remain in this city, and the hands of all the people, by speaking such words to them. For this man does not seek the welfare of this people, but their harm."

Jer 38:5 Then Zedekiah the king said, "Look, he is in your hand. For the king can do nothing against you."

Jer 38:6 So they took Jeremiah and cast him into the dungeon of Malchiah the king's son, which was in the court of the prison, and they let Jeremiah down with ropes. And in the dungeon there was no water, but mire. So Jeremiah sank in the mire.

### **Agabus ... performs a prophecy**

Act 21:8 On the next day we who were Paul's companions departed and came to Caesarea, and entered the house of Philip the evangelist, who was one of the seven, and stayed with him.

Act 21:9 Now this man had four virgin daughters who prophesied.

Act 21:10 And as we stayed many days, a certain prophet named Agabus came down from Judea.

Act 21:11 When he had come to us, he took Paul's belt, bound his own hands and feet, and said, "Thus says the Holy Spirit, 'So shall the Jews at Jerusalem bind the man who owns this belt, and deliver him into the hands of the Gentiles.' "

Act 21:12 Now when we heard these things, both we and those from that place pleaded with him not to go up to Jerusalem.

Act 21:13 Then Paul answered, "What do you mean by weeping and breaking my heart? For I am ready not only to be bound, but also to die at Jerusalem for the name of the Lord Jesus."

### **Isaiah's Calling to be a Prophet**

Isa 6:1 In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lifted up, and the train of His *robe* filled the temple.

Isa 6:2 Above it stood seraphim; each one had six wings: with two he covered his face, with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew.

Isa 6:3 And one cried to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy *is* the LORD of hosts; The whole earth *is* full of His glory!"

Isa 6:4 And the posts of the door were shaken by the voice of him who cried out, and the house was filled with smoke.

Isa 6:5 So I said: "Woe *is* me, for I am undone! Because I *am* a man of unclean lips, And I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; For my eyes have seen the King, The LORD of hosts."

Isa 6:6 Then one of the seraphim flew to me, having in his hand a live coal *which* he had taken with the tongs from the altar.

Isa 6:7 And he touched my mouth *with it*, and said: "Behold, this has touched your lips; Your iniquity is taken away, And your sin purged."

### Isaiah's Commission from the Lord

Isa 6:8 Also I heard the voice of the Lord, saying: "**Whom shall I send**, And who will go for Us?" Then I said, "**Here am I! Send me.**"

Isa 6:9 And He said, "Go, and tell this people: 'Keep on hearing, but do not understand; Keep on seeing, but do not perceive.'

Isa 6:10 "Make the heart of this people dull, And their ears heavy, And shut their eyes; Lest they see with their eyes, And hear with their ears, And understand with their heart, And return and be healed."

Isa 6:11 Then I said, "Lord, how long?" And He answered: "Until the cities are laid waste and without inhabitant, The houses are without a man, The land is utterly desolate



**Act 2:14-21** But Peter, standing up with the eleven, raised his voice and said to them, "Men of Judea and all who dwell in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and heed my words.

Act 2:15 For these are not drunk, as you suppose, since it is *only* the third hour of the day.

Act 2:16 But this is what was spoken by the prophet **Joel**: (*Joel 2:28-32*)

Act 2:17 'AND IT SHALL COME TO PASS **IN THE LAST DAYS**, SAYS GOD, THAT I WILL POUR OUT OF MY SPIRIT ON ALL FLESH; **YOUR SONS AND YOUR DAUGHTERS SHALL PROPHECY**, **YOUR YOUNG MEN SHALL SEE VISIONS, YOUR OLD MEN SHALL DREAM DREAMS.**

Act 2:18 AND ON MY MENSERVANTS AND ON MY MAIDSERVANTS I WILL POUR OUT MY SPIRIT IN THOSE DAYS; AND **THEY SHALL PROPHECY.**

Act 2:19 I WILL SHOW WONDERS IN HEAVEN ABOVE AND SIGNS IN THE EARTH BENEATH: BLOOD AND FIRE AND VAPOR OF SMOKE.

Act 2:20 THE SUN SHALL BE TURNED INTO DARKNESS, AND THE MOON INTO BLOOD, BEFORE THE COMING OF THE GREAT AND AWESOME DAY OF THE LORD.

Act 2:21 AND IT SHALL COME TO PASS THAT **WHOEVER CALLS ON THE NAME OF THE LORD SHALL BE SAVED.**'

### Is there much more to be revealed??

**Amos 3:6-7** If a trumpet is blown in a city, will not the people be afraid? If there is calamity in a city, will not the LORD have done *it*? **Surely** the Lord GOD does nothing, Unless He reveals His secret to His servants the **prophets**.

**Rev 10:7** but in the days of the sounding of the seventh angel, when he is about to sound, the mystery of God would be finished, **as He declared** to His servants the prophets.
