Most churches teach that Jesus died on the cross just before sunset on Friday evening (around Sunset D) and was resurrected 36 hours later on Sunday morning. The Church of God teaches that Jesus died just before sunset on Wednesday evening (around Sunset B) and was resurrected three days and three nights later around Sunset E.

Scenario 1: The Hebrews ate the Passover around the time of Sunset A and the Death Angel came a few hours later. The Hebrews then hung around till around Sunset B before they departed. Therefore, we keep the Passover around the time of Sunset A which is also the time Jesus kept the Last Supper with His disciples.

Scenario 2: The Hebrews ate the Passover around the time of Sunset B and the Death Angel came a few hours later. The Hebrews left some time thereafter. And, since Jesus died around the time of Sunset B, we keep the Passover around the time of Sunset B.

Scenario 3: The Hebrews ate the Passover around the time of Sunset B and the Death Angel came a few hours later. The Hebrews left some time thereafter. And, since we follow Jesus' example, we keep the Lord's Supper/Passover around the time of Sunset A because that's when He did. We keep the Night To Be Much Observed starting Sunset B.
