Teacher s Bible Study

The Holy Spirit is not a separate being; it has no independent existence as an individual entity or person within the God Family. The Holy Spirit is described in the Bible as: the Spirit of God, the Spirit of the Lord, the Spirit of Jesus Christ, the Spirit of truth, and Comforter, or Advocate. It is the power of God, the mind of God, and the extended means by which God accomplishes His work throughout the universe.

It was through His Spirit that God created the earth (Genesis 1:2). It was through this Spirit that David received his moral strength (Psalm 51:10 13). And by it Elijah and Elisha ordinary men were made into powerful prophets of God (II Kings 2:9,15). It is clear that they were among the relative few in the Old Testament who were blessed with the privilege of having the mind and power of God work or dwell within them.

God uses His Spirit to accomplish all His work. Whether causing prophets to prophesy, kings to reign, craftsmen to create (Exodus 31:3), bodies to be moved (Ezekiel 3:12, 14), or people to keep His laws (Ezekiel 36:26 27), everything God does is through the power of His Spirit.

God is spirit (John 4:24); both members of the Godhead (Elohim), Father and son, are literally composed of spirit; they are wholly made of spiritual essence, in the same fashion as we are made of physical particles. Yet God the Father and Jesus Christ are separate beings: each maintains His own distinct identity and independent existence; and each, therefore, utilizes His own Spirit, though both the Father's Spirit and Christ's Spirit are an integral part of the common Holy Spirit.

This same Spirit which was given to the disciples on the Day of Pentecost is available to all whom God calls. Upon true repentance granted by God and upon true belief in Jesus Christ, one may be baptized and then receive God s Spirit through the laying-on-of-hands ceremony performed by God s ministers. Read Acts 2:38; 8:12 17. God further states that He gives His Holy Spirit only to those who obey Him (Acts 5:32). God s Holy Spirit is efficacious it creates deep changes within the individual, actually converting or changing the mind of the person. The Holy spirit generates within Christians its very fruit, which is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith meekness, temperance (Galatians 5:22 23). It encourages us through trials and empowers us to do the Work of God.

Presenting the Bible Story

Have your students not only memorize the memory verse, but also help them to define in their own words the nine characteristics of the Holy Spirit. It is important that they understand why they are learning this scripture. It is also crucial that they comprehend how this truth relates to them and their everyday lives.

Ask your students what they see when they peel an orange? Is the orange divided up into segments? The fruit of the Spirit could be compared to an orange, in that each segment makes up the orange. All nine virtues make up the fruit of the Holy Spirit, but the fruit is one. We do not want the fruit that sin produces, but we do want the character that the fruit of the Holy Spirit produces.

Love

Despite our sins, God loves us unconditionally. "But God commandeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). God wants the very best for us. We need to want the very best for others. We need to value, forgive, and receive family and friends willingly.

Joy

Is joy the same as happiness? No. Happiness comes and goes. Joy on the other hand is present even during difficult times. Joy is a feeling of well being. We have joy when we obey God, and trust in His promises. We have a clear conscience and delight in God's truth. Even during difficult times, there should be joy knowing that God is with us. "My brethren, count it all joy when ye fall into divers temptations" (James 1:2).

Peace

Peace is a state of inner tranquility. Our heart, mind and soul are at peace when we trust God, and keep our sights on Him. Through prayer we can experience the peace of God. Read Philippians 4:6,7. Jesus has promised peace to every believer. "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid" (John 14:27).

Longsuffering "Patience"

Longsuffering is also translated "patience." God has patience with sinners. He is giving us plenty of opportunity. God will help us endure pain, trouble, and wrongdoing that other people bring upon us. "Knowing this, that the trying of your faith worketh patience. But let patience have perfect work, that ye may be perfect and entire, wanting nothing" (James 1:3,4).

Kindness

Showing love and respect for others is kindness. God has been kind to us; therefore, show kindness to others. Read Luke 6:35 and Ephesians 4:32. Kindness is a characteristic of God as we read in the following verses: "O praise the LORD, all ye nations: praise him, all ye people. For his merciful kindness is great toward us: and the truth of the LORD endureth] for ever. Praise ye the LORD" (Psalm 117:1,2).

Goodness

Children know and understand the difference between being good and being bad. When you are good, you are doing what is right. Can we be perfectly good? No we cannot. Why? Because Jesus said, "Why callest thou me good? there is none good but one, that is, God" (Mark 10:18).

To be loyal, stable and dependable is to be faithful. We have faith that God will meet our daily needs, and He will be with us in times of trouble.

Gentleness

Treating others with dignity is treating them with gentleness. God accepts us and others for who we are. We are of value to God. He appreciates each and every one of us. We need to learn to appreciate others as individuals. Jesus did not ignore little children. Jesus did not reject sinners. We need to strive to treat others as Jesus would. Let your gentleness be known unto all men. The Lord is at hand (Philippians 4:5).

Self control

Do you let your feelings and thoughts control your actions? Or, do you exercise control of your actions? Read I Corinthians 9:24 27. Paul learned that in order to be effective as a minister of God, he has to exercise self-control. To explain this virtue, use examples of siblings and friends becoming easily angered and not showing self-control.

Teaching Activities

Art and Activities

Younger Children

Copy the Art Activity page for each student. Students may color their pictures using crayons or felt-tip markers. Out the picture along the heavy outside boarder, glue to a piece of colorful poster board, and out half an inch larger than the picture. Glue a clothespin to the back of the picture so the picture stands up. Show your students how the picture may set on a desk or table in their rooms to remind them to be kind and forgiving.

There is an activity page for each of the virtues of the Holy Spirit. You may want to make copies of these pages and have the children make an activity book out of them. These activity pages go from easy to difficult. You will need to determine which of the pages are best for your students

- 9. How would you describe self control?






